

OLD:

"Internationalisation is the process of integrating an international, intercultural, or global dimension into the purpose, functions or delivery of tertiary education." (Jane Knight)

NEW:

"Internationalisation is the purpose, functions, and delivery of teritary education typical for the globalised world."

Specific Polish way of internationalisation






Internationalisation in Poland 2015 (2005)

- Internationalisation ratio 4,1% (0,46%)




International students in Poland 2000-2016







The percentage of students of Polish origin



The study programs in foreign languages at Polish HEIs








Students from Ukraine 2005-2016

Students from Ukraine in particular voivodships in 2016








